#### **Background:**

- 1. The author is not revealed in the text, but Acts 4:25 reveals for us it was David who penned it.
- 2. We cannot determine the occasion upon which the Psalm was written.
- 3. It is a Messianic or Royal psalm. It is a psalm dealing with God's Ruler and His realm.
- 4. It is a chiastic psalm pointing to God installing His Son as King, and the Son's response to Him.
- 5. Key words in this Psalm: Earth (eres) 3x; Anger/Wrath (ap/np) 3x; Lord (Yahweh) 3x; King (melek) 3x; Nations (goy) 2x.
